The Knowlton Memorial Scholarship was established in 2012 by a gift from The Austin E. Knowlton Foundation and is awarded to one first-year student in an amount that approximates \$5,000 per year, renewable for all four years of study. The scholarship is designed to support students who are residents of Logan County, Ohio, with preference given to those students who are interested in majoring in mathematics or a related field. Absent an admitted student from Logan County, the scholarship may be awarded to a student from another area in Ohio.



How to apply?

In order to be considered for the Knowlton Memorial Scholarship, a student must meet the criteria stated and be a successful candidate for admission to The College of Wooster. No additional forms or application are required. The Office of Admissions will select the successful candidates. About

Austin E. Knowlton

Mr. Austin E. Knowlton, also known as “Dutch”, was the owner and Chairman of the Knowlton Construction Company, an organization started in Bellefontaine, Ohio, in 1937 and whose predecessors dated back to 1906. Through his company, Mr. Knowlton was responsible for over 600 major and significant construction projects throughout Ohio and the Midwest, including school buildings, hospitals, libraries and post offices.

Mr. Knowlton was a 1927 graduate of Bellefontaine High School in Logan County, Ohio, and The Ohio State University, class of 1931, where he received a Bachelor of Science degree in Architectural Engineering. He was an avid sportsman with a 50-year interest in saddlebred horses and an original founding partnership of the Cincinnati Bengals, where he served as Chairman. He also held a major ownership interest for many years in the Cincinnati Reds and a trusteeship of the Little Brown Jug Society for harness racing in Delaware, Ohio. Mr. Knowlton was a leading philanthropist, and The Ohio State University Austin E. Knowlton School of Architecture is named in his honor.
