ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

Centre College is pleased to offer the Austin E. Knowlton Memorial Scholarship. Trustees of the Austin E. Knowlton Foundation established a scholarship at Centre College for accepted applicants with a preference for students who:

- are residents of Ohio.
- are interested in majoring in a STEM field, although all majors will be considered.

To apply for the scholarship:

- Candidates must apply for admission to Centre (commonapp.org).
- A scholarship award of up to \$5,000 is available, with preference for students with financial need.
- The Knowlton Scholarship is renewable annually, provided the recipient remains in good academic and social standing with the College.



ABOUT THE FOUNDATION

The Austin E. Knowlton Foundation was created by Austin "Dutch" Knowlton (1909-2003) in 1981 "to promote and advance higher education in the United States and to provide direct grants and contributions to qualified colleges and universities." Mr. Knowlton grew up in Bellefontaine, in Logan County, Ohio, and studied architecture at The Ohio State University. He then joined and later led the Knowlton construction company which completed more than 600 major construction projects, including school buildings, hospitals and libraries, throughout Ohio and the Midwest. Mr. Knowlton was a minority-stake owner of the Cincinnati Reds and a co-founder of the Cincinnati Bengals.
